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Minnesota-bound! Well, I'm off for vacation on Sunday, August 7, and going west to see my grand-babies! Can't wait to tickle and hug and squish . . . My daughter-in-law told me last week that Isaac bumped into a wall and started crying. And with tears running down his face, he cried "I want Grandma Cyndi." Music to my ears. Well, not that he hurt himself, but that he would think of me as comfort even though I am 2,000 miles away.

We continue to have a full class schedule this next session (September-December). We are blessed to have such great teachers at Emma's who provide a variety of project and technique classes that appeal to so many of you. Back by popular demand is the Paris Tote Bag and the Bali Bag. Emily will be teaching both of these as she is definitely our expert and resident "bag lady." We will also be continuing with our very popular McKenna Ryan Beach Walk series, offering Blocks 8 and 9 this fall. Paula will continue to teach these classes, and many of you have commented that her passion and energy for this technique are contagious! We have had several people express an interest in learning to appliqué but would like to have a class on the different methods so they can determine which technique they prefer. Great idea. So we are offering an "introduction to appliqué" class where we will teach you four different methods for doing appliqué. Barbara will be teaching this class, and we all know how great she is at teaching students new skills.

We've also had requests from customers asking for more intermediate projects since they are interested in bringing their skills to the next level. In response, we have added a more challenging project to our line-up; and who better to teach it than Diana Annis. Diana will be teaching the feathered star pattern and some great tricks to simplify the construction. We are definitely due for a machine quilting class, and Karen Pulaski is always up for the task. You will learn everything you need to know from soup to nuts on machine quilting from an excellent teacher. Because of Karen's breadth of experience in the sewing and quilting arena, she possesses a wealth of information that she willingly shares with all of her students.

Cathy Bodio is continuing with her very popular Wednesdays with Cathy series where students can make any project they like with expert guidance from Cathy. It isn't always easy to work with a group of students who are all making something different, but Cathy seems to do it effortlessly. In fact, she is constantly referred to as "my quilting teacher," a true sign of respect and appreciation.

Dianne Miller, the master at needle-turn appliqué, is continuing on with her very popular Baltimore Album series. We even have one student who drives 2 hours just to attend the class every month. This next session we will be offering the class at two times - our normal Tuesday morning session but also a new Sunday afternoon session to replace the Tuesday evening class so we can accommodate more students' availability. Finally, we have a new teacher - Jody Beck. Jody is a pattern designer and will be teaching some of her patterns here. The first will be Starry Wonder, a unique slash and stack method for creating a design within a design.

Come join us on Sunday, September 18, for our second Quilts of Valor charity sewing day. As the Quilts of Value project is our 2011 shop charity, we will be providing some fabric and the pattern, long-arm quilting services for the quilts we make, and delivering the quilts to the local coordinator for the program. We are also looking for donations of red, white, and blue fabric for this event. If you are interesting in volunteering your talents on September 18, please pre-register so we can make sure we can accommodate everyone.

### STRIP CLUB

Welcome to strip club at Emma's. No, this isn't a meeting that you will be embarrassed to tell your friends about! We have had so many requests for this type of club we finally decided to try it. Who doesn't like pre-cut strips and patterns where you can just sit down and sew. This should be a great club where you can get great-looking quilts with all the efficiency and quickness of pre-cut strips. Here's how it will work. There is a \$20 joining fee for the class session. It will meet the second Saturday of every month at 10 a.m. During the prior month of the strip club meeting, we will showcase the fabrics used in the quilt; but the pattern will remain a mystery. During the meeting we will unveil the monthly strip club quilt and provide a lecture/demo on the quilt construction as well as some other interesting/fun activities. As a club member, if you attend that month's session, you will receive the pattern for free and a 20 percent discount on the strip kit and any required tools as well as your borders and backgrounds.

### 2011 QUILTERS RETREAT

Our next quilters retreat will be held at the Resort and Conference Center at Hyannis on March 9-12, 2012. The retreat will start on Friday morning at 10 a.m.; include eight meals, three nights' accommodations, sewing rooms, mystery quilt, workshop, and activities; and end Monday afternoon at 4 p.m. The price for single accommodations is \$650 and \$499 for double accommodations. As an added incentive, we will be offering a \$50 early registration discount to anyone who signs up before September 30, 2011. We are hoping this will serve as an added incentive for you to encourage your friends to join you at our next retreat. A deposit of \$75 will hold your spot, with the final balance being due no later than February 1, 2012. If you are interested in attending, please sign up soon so we can start to plan the activities for the event. We can also accommodate monthly payments on this to help you manage the cost - a form of "lay away."

### KID'S AFTER-SCHOOL SEWING CLUB

During the past several years we have tried a variety of approaches to teaching kids to quilt and sew, some more successful than others. We continue to be very committed to teaching the next generation of quilters and sewers and so have come up with a much more involved approach to accomplishing this. Starting in October, we will be offering a monthly kid's after-school sewing club. It will be held on Tuesday afternoons from 3:30 p.m. to 5 p.m. and will cater to kids aged 9-17. During the lessons, the kids will learn basic sewing instruction and make a variety of projects, with the focus being on sewing. The idea is that the kids sign up for classes every month October through April to continue to learn new skills and make new projects, with a little bit of focus on community service. The year will culminate in a fashion show, where all the students will get to model their various creations. The price will vary each month, depending on the number of Tuesdays. Sewing machines will be provided. Students will be responsible for the monthly instruction fee as well as any supplies required for their projects. Please see our monthly class schedule for more detailed information about each month's fees.

### MYSTERY SCRAP BAGS

As you can imagine, we collect a large amount of scraps from all of our monthly block programs, end of the bolt remnants, "oops", So what we have started doing is just accumulating the scraps in a very large bag placed by the cutting table. As soon as the bag reaches about 10-12 pounds, we will seal it up and offer it for sale. It is not coordinated fabric and includes a wide variety of style and color. The size of the chunks is anything less than  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard but probably nothing less than  $\frac{1}{8}$  yard. The price of the bag is \$39.99. So if you are a scrap lover, then these bags are for you. When you come in, check with us to see if there are any bags available, as they are sure to fly off the shelf at this price for the amount of fabric you are getting. A win-win for everyone.

**CLASS GUIDELINES**

- Emma's Quilt Cupboard maintains a strong commitment to education and expanding your quilting skills and knowledge. Because of this, our promise to you is to NEVER cancel a class, regardless of the number of people who have signed up.
- Because we appreciate your business, Emma's Quilt Cupboard offers a 10% discount on all fabrics, books, and class-specific supplies that you purchase for your class. Emma's Quilt Club Members will receive a 15% class discount.
- Please note that we have a refrigerator and microwave in the shop's kitchen. Feel free to use them to stow your lunch or snacks if you want to bring something from home.
- You will only be "officially" signed up for a class when payment has been received. You can sign up for a class over the phone, in person at the shop, or by mail, using a credit card, cash, or check.
- Our goal is to provide sufficient time during class for you to complete your class projects or to learn a specific technique. However, please remember that some classes may require homework or "catch up" for less-experienced quilters.
- A supply list will be provided for each class. Please have your fabrics and supplies assembled before the class so that we may start on time. Anyone at the shop will be happy to help you with your fabric selections if you would find that useful. Basic supplies for a quilting class include a sewing machine, cutting mat, rotary cutter, ruler, and basic sewing kit (scissors, seam ripper, pins, etc.).
- When a pattern/book is used for the class, we expect each student to purchase a copy of their own. We respect all copyright laws.
- Refunds for classes will be given. However, we will require a minimum of 1-week's advance notice. Should you withdraw from a class with less than 1-week's notice, all class fees will be forfeited.
- Please note for all machine classes: please bring your sewing machine in good working order and be familiar with its basic functions (e.g., threading the machine, changing the needle, needle position adjustment, and stitch length). While we will do our best to help you with any problems, we are not familiar with all machines. Therefore, it is important that you have a thorough working knowledge of your machine. In consideration of your fellow students, please arrive early to set up your machine. Classes will begin at the scheduled time. Remember your foot pedal and power cord!
- For those of you who do not want to bring your sewing machine to class, we will have a select number of Viking sewing machines for you to use. Please reserve these machines in advance so we can ensure we can accommodate your needs.
- A class passport is applicable for all project/technique classes. All eligible classes have been indicated as "passport classes" in the individual class descriptions. Please note that only passport-designated classes are eligible for the class discount. The cost of the passport is \$99.
